Appearance:

The appearance of a book can make a significant impact on the experience of a reader, whose enjoyment is often enhanced by an enticing cover, an intriguing table of contents, interesting chapter headings, and when possible, eye-catching illustrations.

Plot:

The characters of a book should be well defined with strengths and flaws, and while they do not have to be likable, the reader does have to be able to form a connection with them. The tone should be consistent, the theme should be clear, and the plot should be original or told from a unique perspective. For informative books -- those without plot and characters--this rating refers primarily to your concept and how well you presented it.

Development:

Development refers to how effectively you told your story or discussed your topic. The dialogue should be realistic, the descriptions should be vivid, and the material should be concise and coherent. Organization is also a key factor, especially for informative books -- those without plot and characters. The order in which you tell your story or explain your topic and how smoothly it flows can have a huge impact on the reader's understanding and enjoyment of the material.

Formatting:

Formatting is the single most overlooked area by authors. The way in which you describe scenes, display dialogue, and shift point of view can make or break your story. In addition, excessive grammatical errors and typos can give your book an amateurish feel and even put off readers completely.

Escape from Overtwixt by R. L. Akers is the second book in the series and an engaging fantasy filled with adventure. The story thrusts you into a world torn apart by tyranny and introduces siblings on daring quests. You'll enjoy following Nachton, the young Conjurer, as he survives a deadly encounter with the Vizier. Driven by grief and a desire for revenge, Nachton embarks on a perilous quest to understand the true nature of power and magic. Nachton, Amélie, Cécilie, and Ewan have been successful in many of their adventures, but now, the others worry about Ewan's fate. Their combined efforts aim to rescue Ewan from the Vizier's clutches, unraveling mysteries about the realm's magic and their own identities along the way. Can they unite all the races of the land to make a powerful stand against the evil?

R. L. Akers' epic fantasy tale is beautifully illustrated, and the images complement the complex worldbuilding. I was immersed in the world of nilands—floating islands, fortified cities, and mysterious Shadowlands—which are vividly described to evoke a sense of awe and danger. The characters are complex and evolving; Nachton's growth from a self-assured but naive mage to a wise and self-aware individual is central to the plot, while Cécilie's journey from a frightened girl to a confident princess had me rooting for her authenticity. The settings, ranging from the majestic Alabaster City to the ominous Gaoland prison, are meticulously crafted, and I loved the blend of architecture and culture. Escape from Overtwixt is a fast-paced and action-packed adventure. The descriptive prose conjured up vivid imagery in my mind, and this imaginative work will excite fans of epic fantasy with memorable characters.
